

Home Challenge

Over the last couple of weeks, the children in Reception have been learning about **sharing** in Maths. The children looked at what sharing means (sharing objects equally between two or more groups) and they practiced sharing cookies. The children learnt that there needed to be the same amount in each group, they shared one cookie at a time until all of them had gone.



To extend the children's learning we have created an activity for you to do with your child at home.

Activity: Using familiar objects or toys ask your child to share them equally between two groups (e.g they could share between two people/ toys). Discuss the method for sharing (putting one object in one group, then another object in the other group etc). Use a mixture of odd and even amounts to share, asking your child what they would do if there was one left over.

Other Suggested Ideas:-

- Could share jelly sweets, chocolate, crisps, pencils etc.
- If they are confident with sharing between two groups, share between three groups (using the same sharing method)

Encourage your child to use the key vocabulary in the box below.
