All the children accessing home learning have also been working very hard in every phase and we would like to take this opportunity to thank

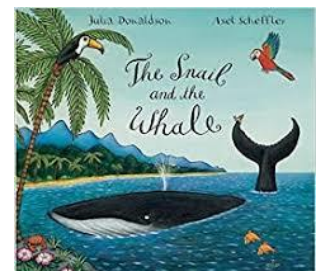
parents and carers for trying so hard to make sure the children access and complete the activities, set both online and in the packs provided, every week.
