


In Year 1 this week we have been writing our own story based on Paddington Bear at the Palace. We have been measuring in math's comparing length and height using rulers. We have





KS 2 Cycle Skills Sessions: Thursday 18th March 2021

The sessions are open to children in who can already ride a bike and would like to develop their cycle skills further. The children will practise their balancing, braking and general bike handling skills through a series of fun cycling games, designed to help them develop into more skilful & safer cyclists. The sessions will be delivered by Modeshift STARS Active Travel Officer, Daniel Neath, as part of our school's commitment to encourage Active and Sustainable Travel to School. The sessions have been risk assessed to meet Covid requirements.

What do I need to bring?

- To take part in the sessions your child <u>must</u> bring:

 1. A bike in good working order. This means you need to have:
 - good working front and rear brakes.
 - well pumped up tyres punctures cannot be repaired, as time does not allow for this.
 - good working pedals.
 - a frame with no cracks on the welded joints.
 - a well-oiled chain
 - secure saddle & handlebars.
- 2. A correctly fitting helmet
- 3. Appropriate clothing. This includes suitable footwear (no open toe sandals/flip flops, heels, loose fitting shoes etc) and a warm, waterproof coat.

If your child does not have a correctly fitted helmet, or bike that is deemed safe to ride, they will unfortunately be unable to take part.


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
