



Are you entitled to a £100 uniform voucher?

Am I entitled to free school meals for my child?

Your child will be eligible for free school meals (FSM) if you are receiving one of the following benefits or support:

- Universal Credit Your annual net earned income must be no more that £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to 3 of your most recent assessment periods.
- Income Support.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income-related ESA.
- Child Tax Credit but not Working Tax Credit and your annual income is below £16,190.
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Parents receiving Working Tax Credit for four weeks after their employment finishes are entitled to free school meals during that period. This also applies to parents who start working less than 16 hours per week.

You are NOT entitled to free school meals if:

 You receive Working Tax Credit except where the 'four week run-on' applies. Even if your child is in Reception to Year 2 and they already receive a free meal under the government's Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM) system, it is still worth applying for FSM. Benefits of successful FSM applications are:

- A £100 uniform voucher (payable on your first successful application only).
- Free school milk up to the end of Year 2.
- Reduced costs for residential visits.
- Other benefits may become available from time to time.

If your child becomes eligible for Free School Meals before 31 March 2022, they will continue to be eligible until they leave Primary Education. This is regardless of any changes in your circumstances and means you do not need to tell us if your circumstances change.

The Government has provided funding by way of the **Household Support Fund,** so that Doncaster Council can support households who would otherwise struggle to buy food or pay essential utility bills.

Doncaster Council has decided to use the grant as follows;

 to fund vouchers for food; for each child eligible for <u>benefits-related Free School Meals</u> for the Christmas and February school holiday weeks. The allocation is £15 per holiday week and the vouchers will be issued by school. There is no need to apply for this as all families in receipt of benefits based Free School Meals will automatically be issued with these vouchers at the end of each term.

The funding will also be used to <u>support families who are not eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals as</u> follows;

- 2. **To provide 1 payment for food** for each child in the household who are <u>not eligible for benefits-related</u>

 Free School Meals where the parent/guardian is receiving any of the following; Council Tax Reduction,
 Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation. The payment will be
 £75 per child for pupils at West Road.
- 3. To provide a maximum of 1 fuel payment per household of £100 to be used towards the winter fuel bill for;
 - o parents/guardians with a child/children in the household eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals.
 - o parents/guardians with a child/children in the household not eligible for benefits-related Free School meals, where the parent/guardian is receiving any of the following; Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation.
 - o single people and couples with no children who are receiving Council Tax Reduction, Housing Benefit or Universal Credit that includes housing costs in the calculation.


To apply for funding under section 2 or 3, you must apply using DMBC's online application at https://www.doncaster.gov.uk/doitonline/apply-for-a-household-support-fund . You cannot apply through school.



READING GUIDELINES FOR PLANNERS

THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN WRITING IN MY CHILD'S PLANNER

The following list is not an exhaustive list but offers suggestions that may be appropriate. It is very important to remember that the enjoyment factor is always worth commenting on. Parents are not expected to comment on each of the following areas after each reading session!

- How enthusiastic is my child about the choice of book?
- Can my child remember the story so far?
- Is my child reading using only the pictures for clues?
- Does my child understand that the words they are reading mean something?
- Can my child read words out of context e.g. when you point to a word without reading the whole sentence?
 - Is my child confident to attempt new words?
- What reading strategies is my child using e.g. sounds, use of the picture, use ofthe context?
 - · Can my child follow the text without using a finger or marker?
- Is there a pattern to the mistakes my child is making e.g. words ending in "ed" orstarting in "sh"?
 - Does my child recognise mistakes and self-correct?
 - Is my child recognising many key words?
 - Is my child aware of punctuation?
 - Is my child reading with expression?
 - How long is my child able to sustain reading?

Dear Parents and Carers,

As half term holiday is now approaching, we would like you to join us in this opportunity to discuss with your child about ways they can keep themselves safe. At West Road Primary Academy, a key focus this term has been Road Safety. In LKS2, we have reminded the children in Circle Times how to stay safe when crossing the road. As many of our children walk home alone, we have reminded them of the rules of crossing the road. These have included finding an appropriate place to cross and when crossing the road using the 'Stop, Look, Listen' method.

This week, our school is learning about Internet Safety as it was Internet Safety Day on 8th February 2022. Please revisit this topic with your child at home and talk about the devices that they may have access to and who to tell if they have a worry.

We would also like you to discuss items which are good and not good for our bodies. Please remind your child that they should not put non-food items into their mouths at any time, either at home or school as they could be swallowed. It should also be highlighted that household products often have warning labels on them and, even though they are used every day, they could be harmful if ingested. Please help your child to identify what can be consumed and who they should ask for help if they are unsure.

Thank you for your support with this matter and we hope everyone has an enjoyable half term.
