<u>Understanding the World</u> <u>- History</u>

Pupils will be learning about George Stevenson, the invention of the Steam Train, transport in the past, different types of transport such as horse and carriages, motor cars, penny farthings, omnibus, ferries, other locally relevant transport from history.

Modern transport pupils will learn about include the Japanese Bullet Train, hovercraft, racing cars, aeroplanes and other examples of technologically advanced transport.

Understanding the World-Geography

Transport in our local area and contrasted with transport for long journeys. We will discuss children's experience of transport.

Road Safety will be covered and we will learn about how we can travel safely.

Pupils will learn how people from different cultures travel such as with a tuk tuk in Bangkok, using gondolas in Venice, Felucca in Egypt and Dog Sleds in Norway.
