This week in EYFS the children have enjoyed learning in provision. They have had fun creating artwork inspired by our artist Jackson Pollock. In Reception, the children have been exploring the composition of numbers in

maths. The children have enjoyed writing about our story 'Whatever Next' in English. In nursery, the children have really enjoyed their PE session and did a fantastic job. Well done EYFS for another fabulous week.





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Year 1 have enjoyed continuing to read 'George and the Dragon' by Chris Wormell. We are learning about nouns (cave,




rock, dragon) and adjectives (spooky, sharp, mighty) ready to write a setting description. In maths we are learning about place value and teens numbers. We have enjoyed improving our drawing skills in art as we learn about architecture. The cold, frosty weather is helping us with our work on the weather and seasons. Please help your child to use 'Teach your monster to read' (see last week's homework letter for your login). We are having a class competition to see who does the most!



This week in Year 2 we have continued to read our book "Hansel and Gretel" we spent time describing the setting of

the story using lots of interesting adjectives and expanded noun phrases. During our maths sessions we have learnt all about symmetry and explored which shapes are symmetrical, even creating some of our own symmetrical patterns. In art we have started to learn about portraits and self-portraits, we followed instructions to draw our own portraits and mixed water colours to create the correct skin tone for our portraits. They are looking fantastic so far and we cannot wait to add more detail to them next week. In music we enjoyed listening to and analysing the music from the film "Frozen". We thought about the different instruments we could hear and the mood which the instruments created. Another super week in year 2, well done everyone.



We have had a very busy week in Year 3/4! We have finished our novel, The Dark and have written our own diary entry in the role of Laszlo. In science, we started our new unit of learning based around light. We

identified natural and artificial sources of light and studied how we are able to see things.

This week, UKS2 have continued their learning about living things and their habitats. They have learnt all about different amphibians



and how their life cycles compare to mammals like us. They have also been learning all about different areas in England and how they compare to Doncaster. Our history learning is leading to our Victorian day on 6th February when children can dress up and experience how children lived in the Victorian times.

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School Procedures for Absentees

First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.


These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
