This week in Reception the children have enjoyed reading our new story 'Look up' by Nathan Bryon. The children did an excellent job predicting what might happen in the text. In

maths, the children have had fun exploring mass and capacity. We have also enjoyed creating our own telescopes, inspired by Galileo. In Nursery this week the children have enjoyed participating in their PE session in the hall. They have also enjoyed learning more about space and creating rockets in the design area.

Year 1 children have been writing their setting descriptions, describing a feast in the castle. They enjoyed tasting some of the food and describing it using adjectives. In maths we have continued learning about numbers



to 20, using a number line and one more, one less. We have learnt about Wales and used atlases to find mountains and cities. In RE, we are learning about sacred places and this week we found out about synagogues.



This week in Year 2 we have spent time learning all about 3D shapes, we have named the shapes and thought about how many edges and faces the

shapes have and named the different faces which we could see. During our dance session with Sadie with learnt about balances and jumps and really enjoyed exploring the different jumps and balances we could do. In science we have continued to learn about electricity and explored making circuits with bulbs and buzzers. We finished our portraits and are really proud of how much they look like us. We are very excited about the upcoming spelling bee and hope that everyone has been busy practising at home. Another super week in Year 2 well done everyone.

In Year 3/4 this week, we have started to read our new novel *How to Train Your Dragon* which we are really excited about! In geography, we have been expanding our knowledge on rivers by studying different rivers in Europe. We have



been continuing to work hard on our times tables too in maths and are getting really good with these.



This week in Year 5/6 we have been continuing to work hard on our English and maths. We are enjoying our novel 'Rooftoppers' and in maths, we have been enlarging shapes by different scale factors. We have also been

learning lots about the Industrial Revolution in history and we were surprised to learn that young children were expected to do very dangerous jobs during this time. In geography, we are continuing to learn about different regions of the UK.

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School Procedures for Absentees

First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.


These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.

Every child has an account for Edshed- seek your child's class teacher for log in enquiries.

The competition will take place firstly in classes, with the children completing a spelling test on 30 of the practiced words. The highest scoring boy and girl from each class will then take part in a year group Spelling Bee in order to determine the top boy and girl spellers/finalists for our school.

Rules:

- The children will be able to write each word down before spelling it out loud.
- During the semi-final and final, children will write the word, press a buzzer and will then be required to say the letters for the word.

Each year group have exciting prizes to be won. Every child at school will have the opportunity to win the Spelling Bee in their year group. All we ask is that they practice their spellings over the next few weeks ready for the exciting competition.
