Should you wish to contact your child's class teacher you can do so by emailing the class email. However, this should not be used to report a child absent. All absence calls should be made to the school office.



In Nursery, the pupils have been reading Julia Donaldson's Monkey Puzzle and describing the animals' features. In maths, pupils have been counting four objects. During continuous

provision time, pupils have been challenged to create animal faces using junk modelling and craft materials. This week, Reception pupils have been learning all about Royal castles. They have learnt about how to tell when the King is in

residence with the Royal Standard flag. They also designed their own castles and labelled them. Fantastic writing, well done!



This week Year 1 have been enjoying learning all about weight and mass in maths. The children have compared objects using a scale and the key vocabulary heavier and lighter. The children have also been learning about the different parts of a plant and have made some botanical sketches of

plants. The children have also been enjoying their geography learning where they have learnt about the Earth's 5 oceans.








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This week in Year 2 we have continued with our new text "The Enchanted Wood" the children have enjoyed meeting the first few characters and writing about them using expanded noun phrases. During our maths sessions we

have spent time learning all about weighing and looking at reading scales and solving maths problems based on this. In geography we continued to learn all about Northern Europe looking at physical and human features which can be found there. The children enjoyed our P.E session looking at invasion games and learning all about attackers and defenders, they worked hard to practise different types of passes. We are impressed with the amount of children accessing times tables and taking up the challenges set by teachers and their peers. Keep up the super work.

Another excellent week for Year 3/4 with plenty of determination and effort shown by all. In maths, we have moved onto



measurement for Year 3 and fractions for Year 4's this has been continued into our second week which the children have again taken in their stride. This week the children have also finished their writing of Alice in Wonderland and have produced some amazing pieces of writing. Across other subject areas, the children have also started plenty of new topics which they all are loving! Keep up the good work Year 3/4.



This week in UKS2, the children have explored more about space and gravity! It is such an interesting unit to learn all about what else is in our universe and we find it so interesting. In English, we have been working really hard on parenthesis (brackets, dashes and commas for extra information). If you see this, please ask your Year 6 child to sing the parenthesis song to you. In maths, we are so proud of our knowledge on percentages: so much knowledge has been gathered already and when tested on arithmetic, the progress has shone in our scores. The Year 6's are feeling ready for their tests in a couple of weeks and have been extremely focussed and resilient.



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## **School Procedures for Absentees**

## First Day of Absence

The Attendance Officer will review registers on a daily basis, between 9am and 9.30am, noting any children absent without a reason being provided. At 9.30am the Attendance Officer (AO) will ring parent(s) on the contact list. If still they have not heard from the parent(s) or contacts on the list, the AO will send a text message to the parent(s) explaining if they do not contact the school within the next 30 minutes, to explain their child's absence, a home visit may well be conducted by the Designated Safeguarding Team.

If still the Designated Safeguarding Lead does not get a response from the parent(s) after a home visit, a home visit may well be conducted by the police. Any child on the Child Protection List, that is absent and we have received no explanation from a parent after ringing every contact on the contact list, will have a visit from the Designated Safeguarding Team. Should there be no response from the home visit, a call to Social Care and the Police will be made.

## Parents' Legal Responsibilities

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure that their child/ren attend school and are responsible for the consequences of non-attendance.

Support will be offered. This will be communicated to parents through the school prospectus, Home/School Agreements, regular items on school newsletters and Friday letters. Meetings will be arranged with those parents whose child/ren have a pattern of absence or attendance falls below 95%.

These will all develop your understanding of parents' legal responsibilities along with involvement in the School Attendance Panel process where attendance shows no sign of improvements.
